Unfortunately, <u>barriers to voting still exist</u>, particularly for marginalized communities. By actively engaging in voter education and registration efforts, our Ys can address these disparities. Our role can be as simple as providing voter information, helping individuals register, or offering transportation to polling places. These small acts make a big difference, particularly for first-time voters, seniors, or those in underserved areas.

While the Y remains nonpartisan, civic participation is essential to building healthy, vibrant communities. Public policy directly impacts the issues that YMCAs care about, and we actively advocate for policies that align with our mission to create environments where everyone can succeed. And, when people engage in civic activity, whether it is voting or volunteering, for example, it supports both their physical and mental health by giving them a sense of purpose, building resilience and social connectedness.

When young people see their communities actively participating in the electoral process, they are more likely to value their role in shaping the future. Our programs can incorporate discussions about civic duty, voter education, and leadership (Youth & Government is a great place to start!). Teaching young people about the importance of voting not only prepares them for future elections but also cultivates a lifelong sense of civic responsibility.

We are known for being a welcoming and inclusive space where people from all walks of life can come together. In a time of increasing polarization, we can offer a platform for respectful conversations about the issues that matter most.
